In this month's newsletter you will see the bulk ticket order form, as well as the CSC's bulk ticket policy. I urge every club to pass out a copy of the policy with every ticket order that your members place. Please make your members aware of the policy. No excuses. As you know, we have had problems with members abusing the program. The resorts don't take kindly to people who sell bulk tickets on eBay, or in parking lots to strangers to make a profit, go to Group Sales with a sorry tale about tickets being lost or stolen, or even worse, make copies of the vouchers.

The resorts have a right to ask for identification at the ticket windows when skiers turn in vouchers for lift tickets. Be aware, have your club membership cards and identification ready to show the ticket agent. Misuse of resort ski vouchers is a crime - don't do it!

These tickets are good for the 2006-2007 ski season and a percentage of unused tickets may be returned for credit toward the purchase of bulk tickets for the 2007-2008 ski season. Bulk Ticket Policy 2006-2007

The following is the policy of the Connecticut Ski Council regarding the sale and use of bulk ticket vouchers.

- Bulk tickets will be sold to Connecticut Ski Council member-clubs only, after one full year of membership in the CSC.
- Bulk tickets are for the exclusive use of dues-paying individual members of CSC-member ski clubs and their immediate families.
- CSC dues must be paid prior to placing bulk tickets orders.
- Distribution of tickets through other avenues such as but not limited to websites, eBay, or resort parking lots, will result in the banning of the individual from purchasing vouchers in subsequent seasons.
- Names of chronic or blatant individual violators will be provided to all CSC-member ski clubs on an annual basis.
- All tickets will be sold by the CSC to member clubs at the discounted face value of the voucher without any additional fees of any kind.
- No club may charge its members a per-ticket fee, and will sell vouchers at the discounted face value only. Shipping/handling/mailling charges may be imposed on members by individual clubs on a PER ORDER BASIS ONLY.
- Violation of these rules will result in possible termination of the individual's membership in his/her club, and possible expulsion of the club from the CSC.

Return Policy:

Killington, Mt. Snow and Sugarbush will only accept 15% unused vouchers at the end of the ski season for credit towards the next season's purchase.

Stratton will only accept 10% unused vouchers at the end of the ski season for credit towards the next season's purchase and Okemo will only accept 20% unused vouchers at the end of the ski season.

Although there is no cap on returns at other resorts at this time, we ask you keep returns to a minimum.

Guidelines will be strictly upheld in order to maintain the integrity of this program.

"The CSC has the right to refuse entitlement of a CSC benefit to any club member who abuses the privilege, or is abusive to any ski area employee or CSC officer when the abuse concerns any promotion, discount ticket program, CSC Awareness Day, CSC Kids Day, or any other CSC function or event. This stipulation may be enacted by two or more officers of the CSC."

Copies of these guidelines should be given to EVERY club member who purchases bulk tickets. These guidelines were printed last season, but I still had people telling me they didn't know there were restrictions on returns. It is important that every club member who purchases discounted vouchers – knows the rules!

Members MUST show valid CSC Club Membership card and can ONLY purchase one ticket for each CSC sticker on the membership card. Tickets are available at the listed pickup location ONLY and sales close at 1 PM.

At the summer Executive Board meeting, a \$300 donation to ASIA was approved. Bill Hornbeck, ASIA executive director, sends his thanks to the Council for this very generous donation. Donations like ours, and ASIA member dues help keep this organization financially sound. Over the past several years, ASIA membership has slowly dropped off, cutting into the overall support of the organization. ASIA dues have remained stable with only a slight increase in its 25 years ("jumping" from \$20 to \$25 for an annual individual membership!) Dues notices were mailed in mid-summer, yet only 350 of the more than 700 members have paid their dues. Get out those checkbooks and pay the \$25!
