FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Fellow Constituents of the Council,

A few quick items as our season gets cooking, and I'll start with the quickest.

If you have kept up-to-date with our CSC meetings as well as the newsletters...you should know that during the May 2022 meeting, the entire Board (i.e., the CSC reps from every ski club) voted to cancel the November 2022 SnowBall due to uncertain conditions with the pandemic. BULK TICKET NEWS

I have Killington ticket pricing I can pass on to you. Killington cost is \$99 each for both adult and youth tickets. **This year there are blackout dates: Nov. 24-27; Dec. 24-31, 2022; Jan. 1; Jan. 14-16; Feb. 18-20,** 2023. There will be a 15% credit on unused tickets that are returned. Pico pricing will also be the same price for both adult and youth. I do not have that pricing as of now. I also do not have signed contracts for either Pico or Killington. As soon as I have Pico pricing I will send the info to bulk ticket coordinators. Be sure to attend the October Council meeting for more information.

Ski Racing

Looking forward to our Monday night race league this year. Monday night is celebrating 50 years of racing! We should be operating similarly to last year at Mount Southington. We will again use AdminSports for racer registration and lift tickets. *No exception* registration will be through them. To make sure there are no exceptions for AdminSports, we will extend the deadline to sign up for racing to noon on the day of the race. If a racer did not purchase a ticket through the AdminSports database last year, it required a manual input of that racer which made more work for the racing crew. Now everybody who purchased a ticket for racing will be in that night's database, so fewer errors.

If you have registered for a race, come down to Southington and get your bib on the first time you race.

Men born in 1958 and prior, women, and all snowboarders will have bibs 1-199. Men born 1959 and later (under 64) will have bibs 200-399. Bibs will be handed out on a first come, first served basis – and since we have the lottery for race bib order each night, a low number is not necessarily an advantage. Please give yourself extra time to get your bib on your first night.

BIBS: We will do as we did last year and hand out CSC bibs for the year. Racers will be responsible to bring their bib each week. Each week will be the same sequence bib order, but the first racer number will vary. Racers **MUST** turn in their bibs on their last race night or their club will be charged for the cost of a replacement bib.

LODGE: The plan is to have the lodge open to racers to put on their boots – however the current plan: **NO BAGS** will be allowed in the building. The mountain will follow CT Covid guidelines, so the mandate will depend on what the mandates are at that time.

OTHER RACES: At this time, there will be no State Slalom nor Giant Slalom, nor Cross Country races. Also, the CT Senior Winter Games (typically at Ski Sundown) have been cancelled for this year. The OnSnow Carnival (no location determined as yet) might be reduced to a one-or-two day event – we will update as soon as we have the proper information.
