Welcome to spring and the close of ski/snowboard season 2024/25. It's time to put a heavy coat of wax on the skis and snowboards for storage over summer and break out our spring gear: bicycles, kayaks, hiking shoes, golf clubs, tennis rackets, and, of course, time to change the wardrobe. We were fortunate to have received a lot of good New England snow this winter, and for those who traveled to the Western USA or Europe, the snowpack was plentiful!

Several of our New England resorts are on sale (Ragged Mountain and Jay Peak among them) and others are in the throes of operational enhancements. Killington, for one is removing its old Superstar lift, but part of the mountain will remain open for skiing as long as it can hold snow. The new chairlift is part of the overall enhancement to complement the Women's World Cup (in conjunction with the new K1 Base Lodge.) The World Cup will move to Beaver Creek for 2025, and is expected to return to Killington the following year.

Our Council is now preparing for the newly introduced "Fall Festival" replacing the annual SnowBall. Newly re-elected VP Jane Suto is the overall chair of the event, and her committee is hard at work planning the event to accommodate budgets and calendars appropriate for all. Her committee will soon lock in a date, so as soon as it is finalized, let's get all of our clubs on board to support the event for 2025.

I sent an email to all ski club presidents requesting some pertinent information about the trips that their ski club took this past year. Several clubs responded immediately, and I am most grateful. To those that have yet to respond...you'll be receiving a reminder from me very shortly. The National Ski Council Federation (NSCF) has requested that each council supply this information to them so that they can have a better understanding of our needs and interests when we communicate with our friends and partners in the travel industry. The NSCF is our parent organization. Please remember that all members of your ski club are entitled to the benefits offered by the Federation by logging into the NSCF website, skifederation.org.

Our final meeting for this year will be held on Tuesday, May 6, 2025, at 7:30 at the Back Nine Tavern in New Britain. The virtual option will be available, and a link will be distributed before the meeting. The CSC meetings for 2025/2026 have been established, and we will be able to return to holding our meetings on the second Tuesday of every month starting September 9, 2025. We will be faced with a monthly meeting room charge of \$100. during 2025/26. We will not be encumbered by that fee at the May 6 meeting; however, we graciously request that you patronize the facility and order a beverage and/or a meal in the Banquet Room. Thank you, I look forward to greeting all of you on May 6 as we wrap up our meeting calendar until September! Kindly.

2025-2026 CSC IKON Pass Program

OVERVIEW:

The CT Ski Council ('CSC' or 'Council') is partnering with Ikon Pass to offer CSC Member-Clubs ('Club(s)')/CSC Members ('Members') the opportunity to purchase Ikon Base Passes at special group rates. Group pricing for 2025-2026 Ikon Passes is being extended to CSC Members who purchase **NEW PASSES** offered through this special program. Members can save per pass ordered through this program compared to standard online pricing, depending on type of pass purchased.

There is no special group pricing for **Renewals** prior to the Ikon Pass Renewal Deadline (mid-April), however, members wanting to 'renew' passes after the Renewal deadline can benefit from the special group pricing. Renewals associated with the Council will apply to the Council's/Club's overall group revenue, provided they are inputted into the Club's tracking sheet.

CLUB INCENTIVE:

The Council is offering an incentive to the participating Clubs. Clubs participating in the Program will be entered into a drawing for a chance to win a 2025-2026 pass. At the conclusion of the program, the Club will raffle off 2025-2026 Ikon Pass(es). Number and type (e.g. Ikon Pass or Ikon Base Pass) of passes being raffled will depend on overall Council's revenue thresholds. Additionally, Clubs meeting certain revenue thresholds may qualify to earn additional passes. So make sure to capture all your Club's activity (renewals and new purchases).

MEMBER BENEFITS:

- Exclusive group pricing
- Extended timeframes for purchasing at reduced rate
- Members not renewing passes by the online deadline (mid-April) can still benefit from the special pricing
- Other Ikon Pass offers still valid (e.g. Child Passes, payments plans, pass protection)

RESTRICTIONS (including, but not limited to):

- Program runs March 13, 2025 through September 2, 2025
- Ikon Pass special pricing only available to 2025 CSC Members
- Ikon Pass pricing subject to change atany time without notice

CLUB PARTICIPATION:

Each Club interested in extending this pricing to its members must identify a Club Coordinator ('Coordinator') who will be responsible for managing the Club's activity and tracking. The Coordinator will share details and track activity with their Club's members.
